



Removal of ATAR requirement

At Torrens University Australia, we take a strengths-based approach to teaching. While the ATAR is a reasonable indication of your performance, this number doesn't necessarily recognise your hard work or the areas where you really shine. We believe your individuality and potential are better indicators of future success.

We have removed ATAR as the key admissions criteria for high school students aiming to study with us. Instead, future students with recent secondary school education will now be guaranteed admission if they have a Year 12 certificate (Australian secondary school certificate) or equivalent.*

Entry programs

We know you are so much more than a number. That's why our entry programs are designed to improve your chances of getting into your dream course by considering criteria other than your ATAR.

Year 12 certificate

Students with a recent secondary school education who have an Australian Secondary School certificate (or equivalent) will be guaranteed admission.*

Diploma or associate degree

Torrens University offers a wide variety of diploma or associate degree courses that provide direct entry into the second year of bachelor degrees, once successfully completed.

Portfolio interview

If you don't meet the academic entry requirements for a Design bachelor degree, you can let your portfolio open doors for you. Submit a minimum of five pieces of your best work to showcase your skills in a related field, and let your real talent shine through.

Work-life experience

We know the best experience is accumulated through the work life you've lived. So for our Business, Hospitality and Design and Creative Technology degrees, you can use your work résumé to get into the Torrens University course you dream of.

Fees & assistance

University fees can be a little confusing, because how much you pay depends on the faculty you choose, the course you study, and the subjects you enrol in. But fear not, help is here with this quick guide.

What is FEE-HELP?

FEE-HELP is a loan scheme which helps eligible students pay their fees. Most students can get a loan for up to \$106,319 (FEE-HELP limit for 2020). Indexation doesn't count towards your FEE-HELP limit. You'll pay the loan back to the Australian Government through the tax system once you reach the minimum income level of \$46,620 (as at 2020–2021 and is subject to change).

How do I apply for FEE-HELP?

If you get an offer from Torrens University Australia and you're eligible, then you'll need to complete a Commonwealth Assistance Form to access FEE-HELP to delay payment of some or all of your tuition fees. You'll need your Tax File Number or a Certificate of Tax File number, and you'll need to submit your form by the due date.

How do I know if I'm eligible?

- You are studying with an approved university – like us.
- You meet the citizenship and residency requirements. You're an Australian citizen or New Zealand Special Category visa holder who meets the long-term residency requirements and who is undertaking at least one unit of study in Australia; OR
- You're a permanent humanitarian visa holder who'll be residing in Australia for your study units; OR
- You're a permanent visa holder who's undertaking bridging study for overseas trained professionals, and residing in Australia for the duration of your studies
- You are enrolled in an eligible unit of study by the census date for the unit
- You have not exceeded the FEE-HELP limit
