





POSTGRADUATE STUDY OPTIONS



A DEGREE TO SUIT YOU

At UC we have a wide selection of postgraduate study options to help you achieve your personal ambitions. We understand you have a busy life and have created progressive delivery options so that your degree is designed to go hand-in-hand with your work or personal commitments.

EXPLORE YOUR STUDY OPTIONS

If you haven't studied for some time or are worried about how to juggle your life with university, then don't feel like you have to dive in headfirst. Our master level courses have two clear exit points where you will still receive a qualification if you decide Master level study isn't for you.



1. GRADUATE CERTIFICATE



Your graduate certificate will introduce you to key concepts and skills in a particular field. It will typically take 6 months full-time, or part-time equivalent.



2. GRADUATE DIPLOMA



Expanding on the graduate certificate, you'll start to develop a more advanced understanding of your specific study area giving you the level of knowledge often required to move up in your career. In most cases, the graduate diploma can be used as a credited pathway into further postgraduate study. It will typically take 1 year full-time to complete a graduate diploma, or part-time equivalent.



3. MASTER BY COURSEWORK DEGREE

1.5-2 years

A master by coursework degree will give you a competitive edge when advancing or changing careers. It's a great way to differentiate yourself and will give you the skills and specialised knowledge to take the next step. A master by coursework degree will typically take 1.5 to 2 years full-time to complete, or part-time equivalent.



HIGHER DEGREE BY RESEARCH (HDR): MASTER BY RESEARCH OR DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY

HDR programs require a supervised research component that contributes to the body of knowledge and advancement in a specific discipline. Pursuing a HDR program will help you make an impact and become an expert in your field.

A master by research degree will typically take 1.5 to 2 years full time to complete, or part-time equivalent.

The maximum duration of a PhD course is 4 years full-time equivalent enrolment. PhD students have a target date for thesis submission of 3 years (36 months), inclusive of one year of coursework study.

ONLINE OPTIONS

Achieve work-life balance and study online with limited on-campus elements. Studying online is a great way to achieve the flexibility to suit your pace and lifestyle with the added bonus of no exams. Your course will be focused on actively engaging within a business context and completing real-world industry projects. Our online degrees are fully accredited and highly regarded by employers.

Your road to success

If you haven't studied previously don't count yourself out. At UC we recognise your industry experience meaning you may not necessarily need a degree to take on postgraduate studies.


COURSEWORK PATHWAYS


Postgraduate studies by coursework develops your knowledge and skills in an industry or profession. Depending on your program, your postgraduate studies by coursework will typically take between 6 months to 2 years (full-time).

RESEARCH PATHWAYS

A Higher Degree by Research (HDR) involves a supervised research component, suitable for those looking to contribute to the growth and development of a specific area.

Your postgraduate studies by research will typically take between 1.5 to 4 years (full-time).





RECOGNITION OF PRIOR LEARNING AND CREDIT

Studied previously? Been working in the industry? You could have your previous experience recognised and complete your degree sooner. You can apply for recognition of prior learning to be credited towards your degree when you apply to study at UC.

As a company Instaclustr supports, automates, secures and manages open source data layer technologies for high performance, high scalability distributed applications in the cloud. Now as a well-established business with 105 employees, the company works closely with high profile clients including Epic Games, who developed the popular video game Fortnite.

Students can look forward to gaining firsthand experience in the industry through UC's Work Integrated Learning program (WIL) and complete an internship with Instaclustr.

"The best part about the WIL program is they get to see and experience what it's like working in the software engineering industry, particularly on what we consider to be world leading technology for some of the world's largest distributer applications."

HOW TO APPLY

APPLICATIONS AND ADMISSIONS

Before you apply, you should choose your course of study, check the admission requirements and have your supporting documents ready. Detailed information on all courses offered at UC can be found by searching our online course finder: canberra.edu.au/future-students/study-at-uc/find-a-course

The application process will differ depending on your course.

GRADUATE CERTIFICATES, GRADUATE DIPLOMAS, MASTER BY COURSEWORK DEGREES

1. APPLY ONLINE*

Most postgraduate applications can be submitted directly to the University, through UC's online application portal at canberra.edu.au/apply

The University does not accept paper applications and there is no application fee for applications.

2. ACCEPT YOUR OFFER

Applications are assessed and made on an ongoing basis throughout the year by the UC Admissions team. Applications generally take around a week to assess and you will be notified of the outcome as soon as possible. During peak periods, there may be a delay in receiving your outcome.

Details on how to accept will be included in your offer letter. You will also receive information about enrolling in units.

3. START YOUR STUDIES

Welcome to the University of Canberra! Once you have been accepted into your course you will be able to enrol in your units. You can self-enrol online through the MyUC student portal or visit the Student Centre on campus in Building 1 for face-to-face assistance.

*Please note, applicants for the Master of Clinical Psychology, Master of Physiotherapy, Master of Occupational Therapy or Master of Speech Pathology must apply through a different portal: The Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) (uac.edu.au/institutions/university-of-canberra). There is a non-refundable processing charge of \$70 AUD for on time applications. Applications made directly to the University for these specific courses will not be processed.

DOCTOR OF PHILOSOPHY (PhD), PROFESSIONAL DOCTORATE, MASTER BY RESEARCH DEGREE

STEP 1

Click on the HDR Application Portal and create an account.

STEP 2

Check your eligibility to apply for a Higher Degree by Research using the Eligibility Calculator.

STEP 3

Complete an Expression of Interest (EOI). The Faculty will review and provide feedback to you. You may be invited by the Faculty to submit a full application (an EOI must be approved before you are invited by the Faculty to submit a full application).

STEP 4

If invited, log back into the HDR Application Portal and submit a full Application..

On time applications close one month prior to orientation week for a given study period. Please note applications received after these dates will not be penalised and will still be considered, however we strongly recommend that you submit your application on time to allow for sufficient processing before the commencement period.

FEES AND FINANCIAL SUPPORT

UNIVERSITY FEES

As a UC domestic student, there are a number of fees you may need to pay throughout your studies. Please refer to the course pages on the UC website for fees related to specific courses. The fees you pay will depend on your enrolment status, and whether you are studying a postgraduate coursework or a postgraduate research degree. A domestic student includes anyone who is an Australian citizen, New Zealand citizen, Australian Permanent Resident or holder of a humanitarian visa.

POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK

University fees for domestic students studying a coursework program are either Fee-Paying Places (FFP) or Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP). How much you end up paying for your course depends on the type of fees associated with your degree.

1. FEE-PAYING PLACES (FPP)

If your course is a Fee-Paying Place, the price listed on the online course finder is the indicative annual fee for students enrolled in full-time study. Although FPPs are not subsidised by the Australian Government, you can still access a FEE-HELP loan to assist with paying your fees. Please see Financial Support on the next page for further information.

2. COMMONWEALTH-SUPPORTED PLACES (CSP)

Commonwealth Supported Places are available for select postgraduate courses at UC. You can check for CSP availability in the fees section of the course webpage. You are not required to apply for a CSP separately, you will automatically be assessed for eligibility for a CSP after you submit your application for admission. If successful, you will receive written notification with your offer for admission.

If you're enrolled in a CSP, Australian Government funding subsidises most of your university fees and you only need to pay the remaining amount. This is called the Student Contribution Amount (SCA). You can choose to pay your Student Contribution Amount upfront, or you can access a HECS-HELP loan to assist with your fees. Please see Financial Support on the next page for further information.

Student Contribution Amount (SCA)

Each year, the Australian Government releases the Student Contribution Range which identifies how much a university can charge students. At most universities in Australia, including the University of Canberra, students are charged the maximum amount.

Please refer to the Student Contribution bands and ranges table below for indicative fees.

POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH

For domestic students pursuing a HDR program, you will be provided for under the Federal Government's Research Training Program (RTP) funding model, which provides a fee offset scholarship to pay your fees for the standard duration of your course (2 years for Master by Research, 4 years for PhD and Professional Doctorate). Once your RTP entitlement is consumed, you will be charged the fee rate for the current year, noting that fees are indexed annually.

STUDENT SERVICES AND AMENITIES FEE (SSAF)

The SSAF is a compulsory fee for the provision of student services and amenities of a non-academic nature, such as sporting and recreational activities, employment and career advice, childcare, financial advice and food services. You can choose to pay your SSAF upfront, or you can access a HECS-HELP loan to assist with your fees. In 2023 the maximum fee for a full-time student will be \$326.00 and \$244.50 for a part-time student.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT

All university fees can be paid upfront, or you can choose to use the Higher Education Loan Program (HELP) to defer paying your fees until a later date. The Australian Government Higher Education Loan Program consists of two loan schemes known as HECS-HELP and FEE-HELP.



HECS-HELP

Higher Education Contribution Scheme (HECS) is the type of loan you take out as a university student to pay your Student Contribution Amount. All students enrolled in a Commonwealth-Supported Place (CSP) are eligible for a HECS-HELP loan.



FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is a similar loan scheme to HECS-HELP but for students enrolled in a Fee-Paying Place. FEE-HELP differs from HECS-HELP in that it has a maximum limit that can be borrowed (known as the FEE-HELP limit) and is usually for university students studying postgraduate courses. For 2023, the HELP loan limit is \$113,028 for most students.

APPLYING FOR HECS-HELP AND FEE-HELP

When you enrol at university, you'll be asked to complete an online form and select your preferred billing option. You can choose to pay your fees upfront, make a partial payment and defer the remaining fee, or defer the whole payment via your HELP loan.
