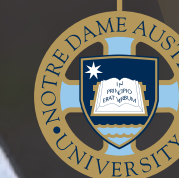

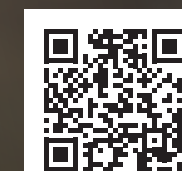

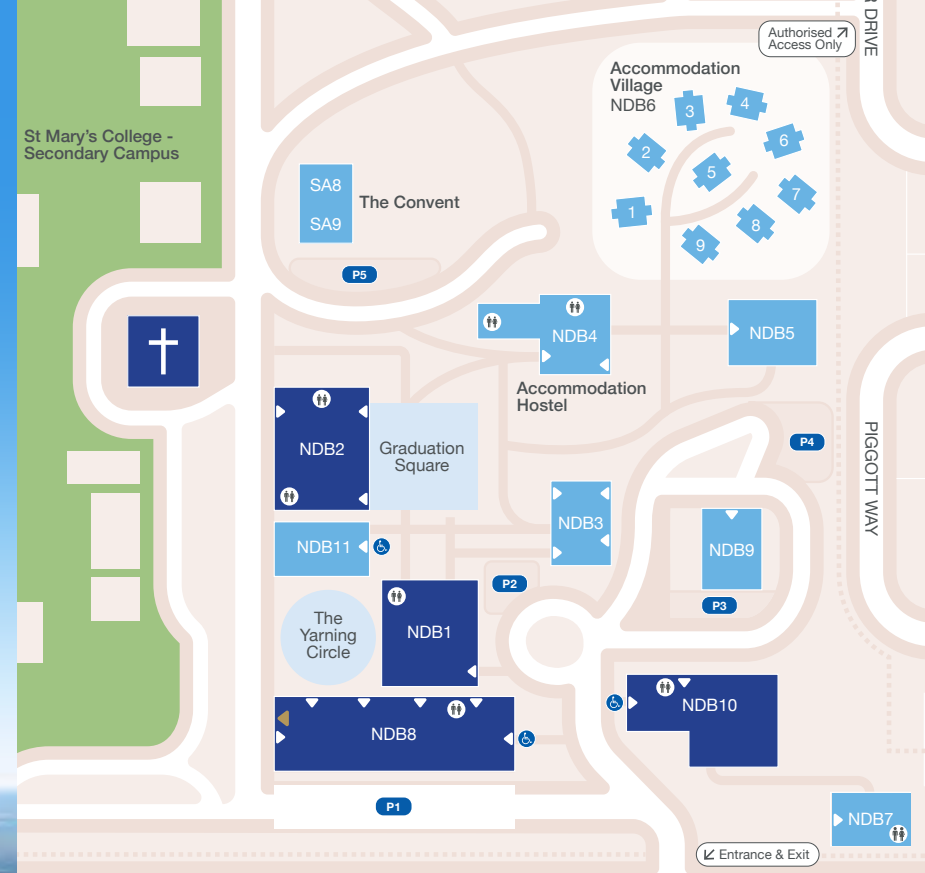
## Transport

Located on the stunning, tropical north-west coast of Australia, Notre Dame University's Broome Campus supports important connections with local Indigenous communities and offers the only opportunity for remote regional tertiary education in Australia.



## Extraordinary remote experience

On the north-western tropical fringe of Australia, Notre Dame's Broome Campus is located centrally on Yawuru Country in this remote town, providing the only opportunity for remote regional tertiary education in Australia.

Broome is known for its culture and arts, connecting people with the extensive Kimberley region. Within the town itself Notre Dame's Broome Campus is close to numerous focal points including:

- Renowned Cable Beach
- Broome Chinatown, home to Broome's rich multicultural pearling heritage
- Tourist opportunities including Indigenous cultural tours, art galleries, Malcolm Douglas' Crocodile Park and the Broome Bird Observatory
- Broome Boulevard Shopping Centre and Paspaley Plaza with more than 50 shops combined
- Broome Recreation and Aquatic Centre
- Multiple restaurants and event venues to support a thriving arts and culture

## Schools

Originally the Nulungu College for remote Kimberley Aboriginal students to attend the neighbouring Catholic school, Broome Campus has more than 20 buildings on 12 hectares of tropical and bush tucker gardens. With Graduation Square positioned at the heart of the campus, we also have 60 beds available in our on-site accommodation. As well as a hall utilised by community and staff alike and the Father Jobst Library boasting a vital local history collection, the campus is home to Nulungu Research Institute, Majorlin Kimberley Centre for Remote Health, and Vocational Education Training pathways.

## Transport

Central to all activities within the township, the Broome Campus is situated close to the town bus route and just a short walk or bike ride to anywhere within the town.

The Institute for Ethics and Society (IES) is a cross-disciplinary team of moral philosophers, bioethicists, and social scientists conducting both pure and applied research. Based on the Sydney Campus, our research aims to improve contemporary social, political, and individual life by exploring a range of subjects, including: how the virtues can strengthen civil society and support human flourishing; life, death, and the care we receive; and the role of religion and spirituality in political and personal life. Our researchers have partnered with a wide range of industry and community partners, from schools and hospitals to grassroots political groups and religious organisations. The IES research focus areas are: Moral Philosophy and Ethics Education; Bioethics and Healthcare Ethics; and Religion, Culture and Society.

### Institute for Health Research

The Institute for Health Research (IHR) provides expertise in the design and analysis of complex health research with University researchers and those in the wider healthcare system. Through supervision of postgraduate research students and involvement in collaborative studies with other academic and clinical researchers, the IHR has a vibrant research focus with strong industry links. Our research seeks to improve the health and wellbeing of the community.

### Nulungu Research Institute

The Nulungu Research Institute focuses on five core research themes – Culture Country and Language; Transformative Learning; Aboriginal Wellbeing; Sustainable Lifeways and Social Justice; and Policy Practice and Evaluation – within a context of valuing Aboriginal knowledge. Based at Notre Dame University in Broome, a Campus of Reconciliation, our research is guided by our collective vision, 'To conduct collaborative research which is transformative, decolonising, and of value to Aboriginal people with a focus on the Kimberley'.

A key feature of Nulungu's research profile is impactful community-driven collaborative projects with national and international academic institutions, teaching and research communities, government, and industry.

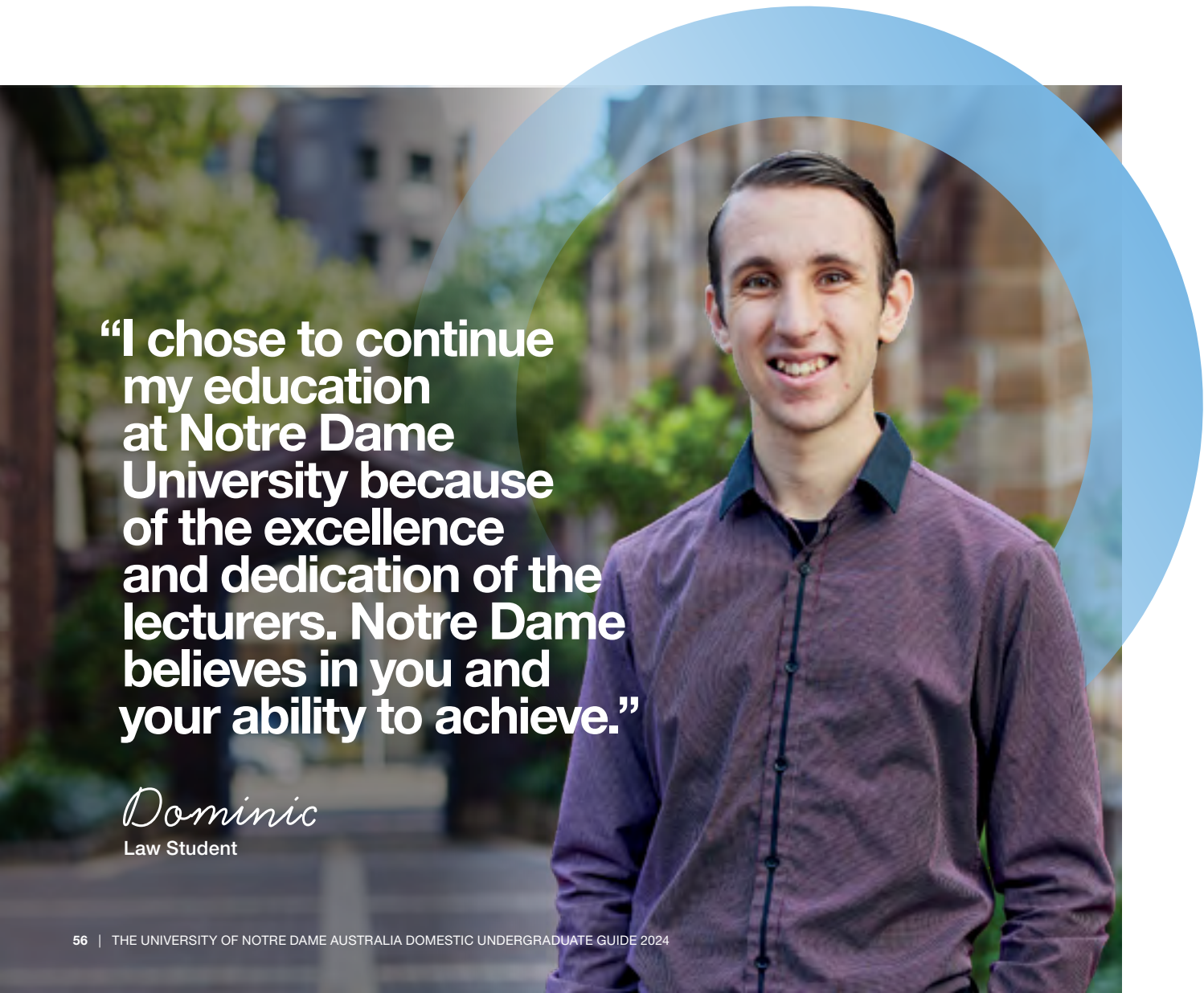

### Literacy and Numeracy Testing for Initial Teacher Education Students (LANTITE)

All Education students are required to successfully achieve the standard in both the Literacy and Numeracy components of the Literacy and Numeracy Test for Initial Teacher Education students (LANTITE) prior to enrolling in their final teaching internship. The LANTITE is administered externally by the Australian Council for Educational Research (ACER) and students will be required to register with ACER and pay for the test.

### Teacher Performance Assessment

All students are required to successfully complete the Graduate Teacher Performance Assessment in connection with their final teaching internship.

Education students who have English as an Additional language and are admitted on the basis of an International English Language Testing System (IELTS) assessment, or an equivalent English language proficiency assessment, are only admitted if they have attained an overall IELTS (or equivalent) score of 8.0 (with no score below 7.0 in any of the four skills areas and a score of no less than 8.0 in speaking and listening).

Students will engage in a curriculum that has, at its core, patient safety and person-centred care. There will be a focus on critical thinking, clinical reasoning, critical reflection and the use of current evidence and research that are essential in the development of sound clinical judgments and decisions to practise safely in a complex health environment.

Person-centeredness, communication and cultural safety will be explored in both the theoretical and professional practice components of the program. There will also be a focus on the healthcare needs and approaches to culturally safe nursing care for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Students will explore current and emerging global, national and regional health priorities.

The curriculum takes an iterative approach to learning and developing Registered Nurse capability.

This program provides a pathway to a Bachelor of Exercise & Sport Science degree and is an upskill option for current industry professionals. ## Professional Experience

As with all our degrees, the Doctor of Medicine places a strong emphasis on practical training and experiential learning. Throughout the four years of your study you will undertake clinical placements in a variety of settings including aged care facilities, public and private hospitals and general practice.

Your third and fourth years are clinically based and present the opportunity to explore the different disciplines of medicine such as paediatrics and surgery. You will complete discipline-based rotations in a clinical setting, and further develop your research skills with a translational research project and/or clinical audit based in the hospital sector. There are rural/remote training opportunities including, for some students, with a Rural Clinical School placement in one or two of the clinical years.

Studying for a Doctor of Medicine (MD) is demanding and entry is highly competitive. The Pre-Medicine Certificate is designed for students who are interested in applying for Medicine at Notre Dame (Fremantle Campus) upon the completion of their undergraduate degree.

Spanning three compulsory subjects and one elective, these subjects are studied alongside your undergraduate degree. Over the course of your studies, you will undertake subjects such as Health, Medicine and Society; Culture Care, Diversity and Universality; Human Caring through Service Learning; as well as an elective in areas like Aboriginal People, Behavioural Science, Biological Science, Counselling Skills and more. You will be guided by the Pre-Medicine Certificate Team who will help you with your journey through the program.

**Please Note:** The completion of the Pre-Medicine Certificate does not guarantee you entry into the School of Medicine Graduate Medicine program. However, should you meet the required GPA and GAMSAT scores, and successfully complete the Pre-Medicine Certificate program, you will automatically progress to the interview stage for graduate Medicine at Notre Dame's Fremantle Campus.

The Pre-Medicine Certificate is a flexible program which runs concurrently with your undergraduate degree. The following is an example of how to progress through the program:

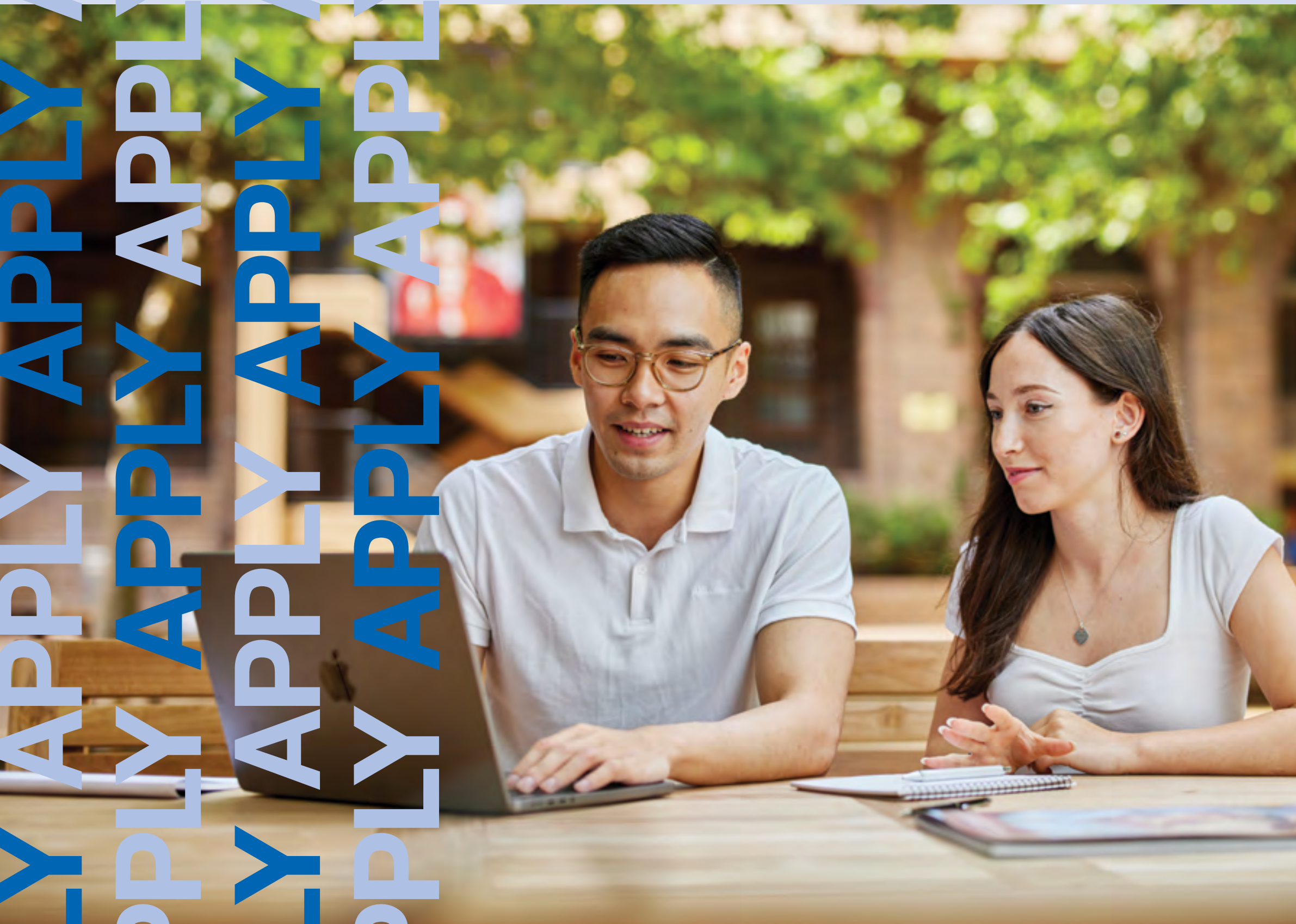

## Notre Dame University's admissions process

At Notre Dame, we want everyone to have the opportunity to pursue tertiary study. As a result, we offer multiple pathways for entry to the University as follows:

### Adjustment Factors

Notre Dame's admissions process goes beyond a single score and, like the Notre Dame study experience, is focused on the whole person. For ATAR students, this includes adjustment factors which will be included to create your Selection Rank.

Notre Dame's adjustment factors seek to address adversity faced by students, reward exceptional performance and recognise extracurricular activity, as well as allow consideration for specific (disadvantaged) cohorts and priority groups. They are designed to ensure every student has the opportunity to achieve their goal of gaining entry to — or pursuing study at — Notre Dame.

Adjustment factors are additional points which are added to a student's ATAR (or equivalent) to create their Selection Rank. Applicants can receive up to 5 adjustment factor points from each of the below categories, to a maximum of 10 in total.

#### Adjustment factors may include:

**Individual factors:** We consider the whole person and recognise non-academic achievements, such as personal qualities, work and life experience and contribution to community life.

**Equity adjustments:** Students who have experienced significant educational or other disadvantage due to circumstances beyond their control may qualify for equity adjustments.

**Location-based adjustments:** This applies to current and recent school leavers who live or attend school in designated areas as follows:

- If the area you live in or the school you attended is classified as being of socio-economic or socio-educational disadvantage, you will qualify for adjustment factors
- If you attended a school in an area which is classified as rural or regional, you will qualify for adjustment factors

**Subject Performance:** Current and recent school leavers who achieve outstanding results in school subjects which are relevant to their chosen program at Notre Dame will receive adjustment factor points, depending on the level of results achieved.

**Elite Athletes & Artistic Performers:** Athletes who compete at — and performers who have had success at — a state, national or international level may be eligible for adjustment factor points.

**University Priority Groups:** Notre Dame recognises Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander students, along with Australian Defence Force (ADF) personnel, as priority groups who may be eligible for adjustment factor points as part of their application.

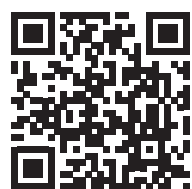


## Scholarships: realising your potential and goals

## Fee information

### Investing in your future

Notre Dame is committed to making all its programs as affordable and accessible as possible, with its fee structure reflecting this goal.

### Commonwealth Supported Places and HECS-HELP

All undergraduate programs offer Commonwealth Supported Places (CSP). Students allocated a CSP will have a portion of their tuition fees paid by the Commonwealth Government.

Australian citizens, holders of permanent humanitarian visas and eligible New Zealand citizens who are in a CSP are able to access HECS-HELP to defer all or part of their tuition fees through a Commonwealth Government loan which is paid back when the borrower's income reaches a certain threshold.

Permanent residents and New Zealand citizens who are not eligible for HECS-HELP can still apply for a CSP to receive the lower fee rate but must pay their student contribution amount in full by the first course Census Date.

### How fees are calculated

Students who have a CSP have their fees calculated against Fee Bands set by the Commonwealth Government. The cost of a course will depend on the Fee Band that the course belongs to. For example, a student enrolled in a Bachelor of Education (Secondary)\*, will study Education courses in Band 1 but may also wish to study Business courses that come under Band 4 and, as such, cost more than courses in Band 1.

### How do I apply for a Commonwealth Supported Place?

Eligible students will be offered a CSP, you do not need to apply. Upon enrolment in your courses at Notre Dame, you will be sent an invitation email from the Government to complete an electronic Commonwealth Assistance Form (eCAF). As part of this application, you will also be asked to submit your Tax File Number (TFN) and your Unique Student Identifier (USI).

Students should consult [studyassist.gov.au](https://studyassist.gov.au) for further information and up-to-date eligibility requirements.

### Pre-University Program

Eligible students undertaking the Tertiary Pathway Program who are allocated a Commonwealth Supported Place and have completed an electronic Commonwealth Assistance Form (eCAF) will pay no tuition fees for this program.

### Additional study costs

The additional costs of study will vary from student to student. Additional costs include textbooks, uniforms, accommodation, public transport, photocopying, stationery and food.

### Financial assistance

Austudy, ABSTUDY and Youth Allowance schemes are operated by the Australian Government and provide financial assistance to eligible students. For further information, please contact Centrelink on 13 24 90 (Youth Allowance and Austudy), or 1800 132 317 (ABSTUDY) or visit Services Australia.
