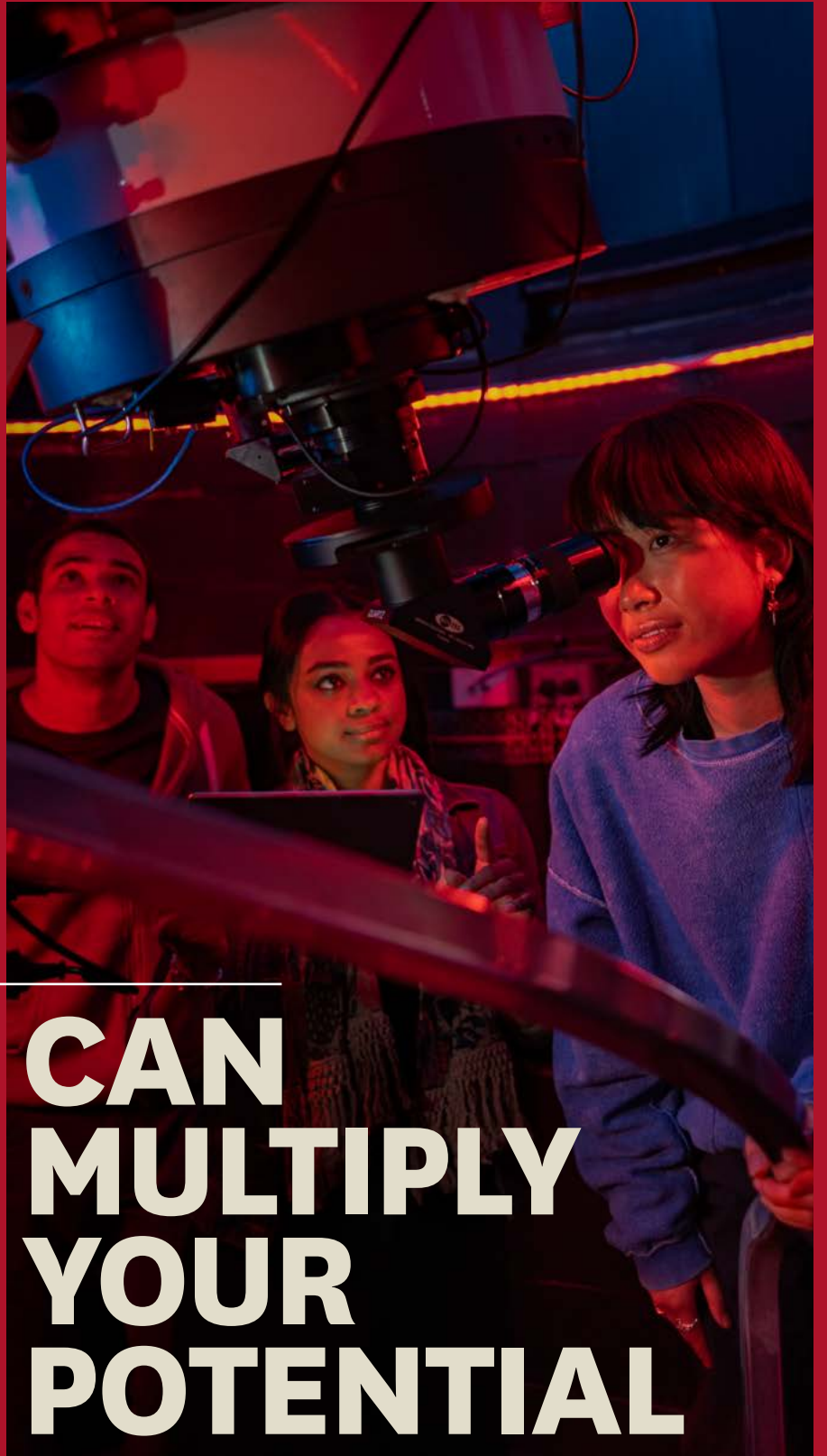

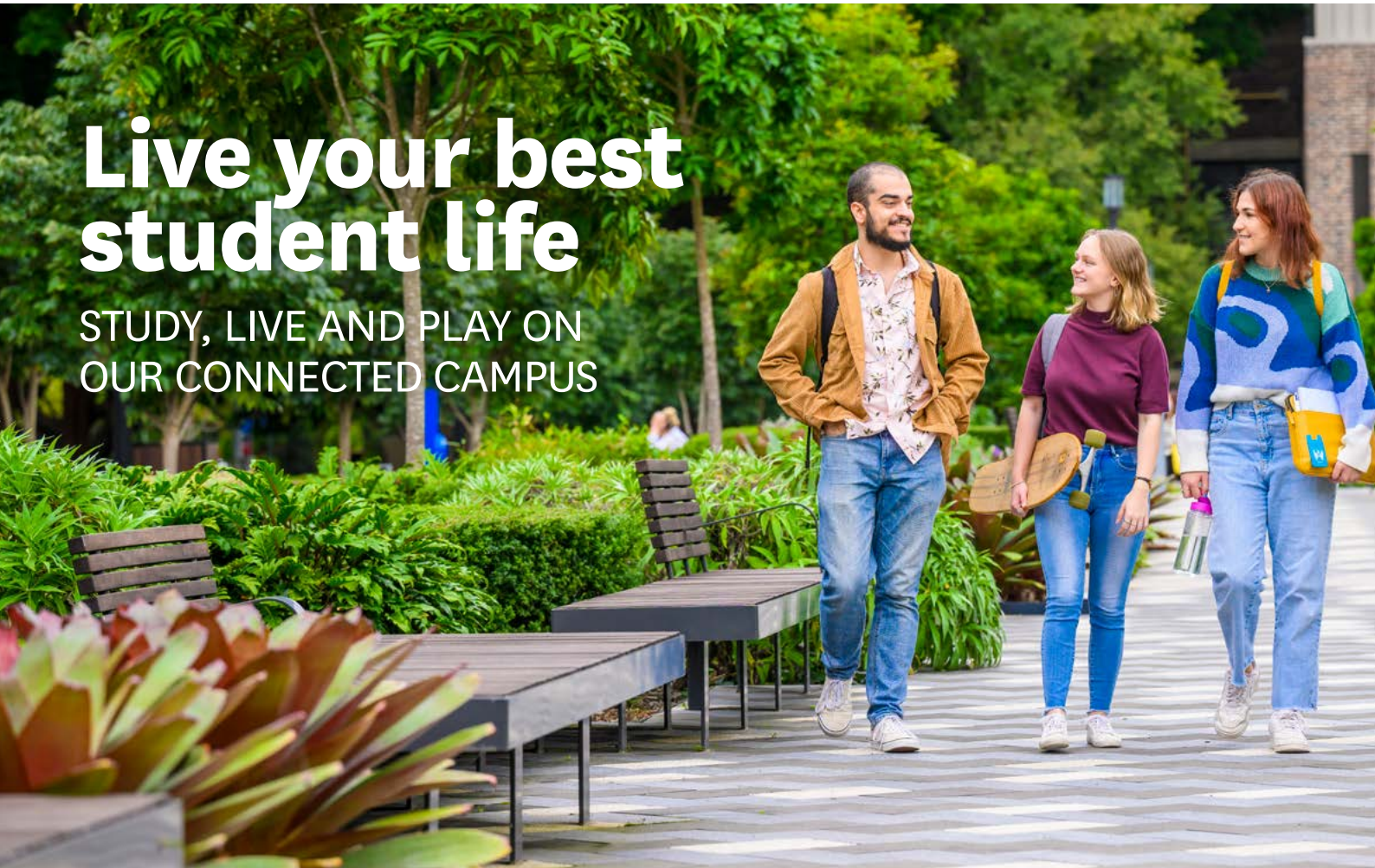

LIFELONG CONNECTIONS

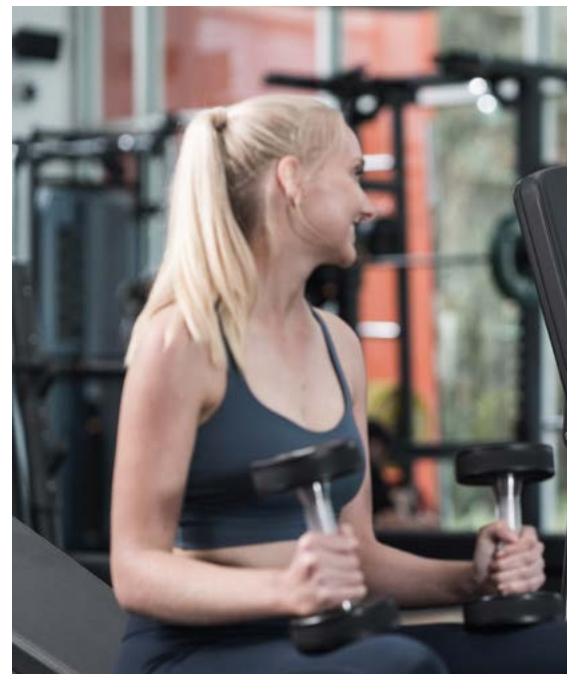

ACCOMMODATION

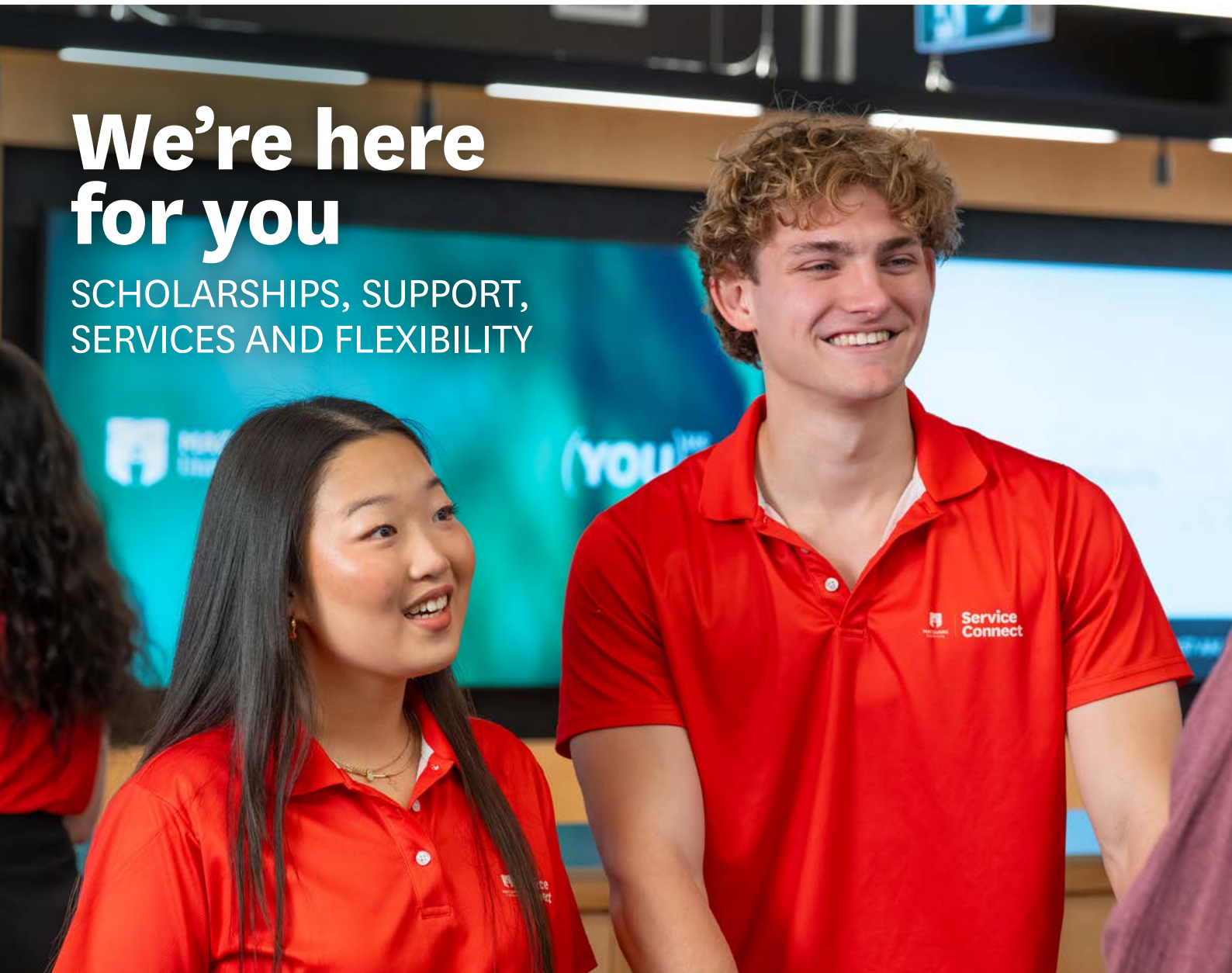

FEES AND OTHER COSTS

A LONG-TERM INVESTMENT

It's true that there are costs involved with uni study. But getting a degree is one of the best investments you can make to secure your future. Plus, we offer lots of support if you need a helping hand.

COURSE FEES

If you're a domestic undergraduate student in a bachelor degree or diploma, you're known as a Commonwealth supported student. This means that the Australian Government will pay part of your fees, with the remaining amount being paid by you. This amount is called your student contribution and can be paid up front at the beginning of each session or deferred through HECS-HELP (if eligible). If you choose to defer your payment, you'll begin paying your fees once you enter the workforce and your income exceeds a certain threshold (\$67,000 in 2026).

STUDENT CONTRIBUTION

Course fees are set by the Australian Government and vary according to the subject area you study. In 2026, the annual student contribution amount for each subject area, based on 80 credit points (full-time study load), falls into one of four bands (see table at right).

STUDENT SERVICES AND AMENITIES FEE

The student services and amenities fee (SSAF) is a nominal amount to be paid on top of your student contribution each session. It provides funding for student support services, employment programs, sport and recreation facilities, and food and beverage operations, among others. As with the student contribution for course fees, the SSAF can be paid up front or deferred through SA-HELP (if eligible).

OTHER COSTS

Beyond your tuition fees, you need to consider the extra costs of being a student: transport, books, software, accommodation and parking are all common expenses.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT AND SCHOLARSHIPS

We believe that all students who wish to study at uni should be able to do so, regardless of their financial situation. That's why we offer a generous suite of scholarships and provide a range of financial support services. The Australian Government also offers financial assistance through Austudy, ABSTUDY and Youth Allowance.

LEARN THE LINGO

ATAR

The Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) is a number between 00.00 and 99.95 that indicates your rank relative to all students in your age group (ie students aged 16 to 20 years), not your Year 12 group. The average ATAR is usually around 70.00.

UAC

The Universities Admissions Centre (UAC) receives and processes most applications for admission into university in New South Wales and the Australian Capital Territory.

SINGLE BACHELOR DEGREE

A single bachelor degree typically involves three or four years of full-time study in one specific area. While you'll have the flexibility to study units from a range of different areas, your degree ultimately focuses on one main area of study.

UNIT

A unit is what we call a subject. Most full-time students take four units – all worth a fixed number of credit points – per session. A unit usually requires about 12 hours of study each week.

SESSION

A session is just like a school term. We have two main sessions: Session 1 (February – June) and Session 2 (August – November).

CREDIT POINT

To graduate, you need to have completed the specified number of credit points for your degree. For many degrees, this is 240 credit points; however, some degrees require the completion of a higher number of credit points.

SELECTION RANK

The selection rank considers your ATAR or equivalent rank plus any adjustment factors you're eligible for. You can combine our adjustment factor schemes to receive additional points for most of our degrees.

UNDERGRADUATE

An undergraduate student is one who is studying their first degree – known as a bachelor degree. Once you've been awarded your bachelor degree, you become a graduate.

DOUBLE BACHELOR DEGREE

A double bachelor degree involves studying two complementary or completely different degrees. A double degree increases your career flexibility and can be completed faster than two single degrees.

CORE ZONE

Your degree's core zone provides the focus of your preferred area of study and consists of all the units you'll need to complete to meet your degree's requirements.

LECTURE

A lecture is where you'll learn most of your degree content. Lecture length varies from unit to unit, but most run for one or two hours. Some take place in large theatres, while others are in smaller rooms.

PREREQUISITE

A prerequisite is a school subject – such as HSC Mathematics – that must be completed, or a requirement that must be satisfied, before you can enrol in a particular unit.

ADJUSTMENT FACTORS

Adjustment factors are additional points that may be used in combination with your ATAR to calculate your selection rank. Adjustments don't change your ATAR; they only change your selection rank.

EARLY ENTRY

Through one of our early entry schemes, you could receive an offer to a degree before you sit your final Year 12 exams. Offers are based on Year 11 results and other criteria, and are subject to the awarding of your Year 12 qualification.

MAJOR

A major is a specific sequence of study that allows you to explore your interests in greater depth. About half of our degrees offer majors. You may be able to combine two different areas with a double major.

ELECTIVE

An elective forms part of a degree's flexible zone. Electives can be undertaken from within or outside your area of study, allowing you to personalise your degree and follow your passions.

TUTORIAL

A tutorial, or 'tute', generally includes 20–30 students and is an opportunity to ask your tutor questions and talk about the degree material with other students.

ASSUMED KNOWLEDGE

Some units assume that you have certain knowledge and skills from previous study, such as the HSC. Introductory units and bridging courses are available if you don't have the assumed knowledge.

Right now, I'm drawn to clinical audiology, medicine, and biomedical or biotech engineering. Each of these areas connects to what I love most about my studies: understanding how the body works and using that knowledge to improve people's health and wellbeing."
