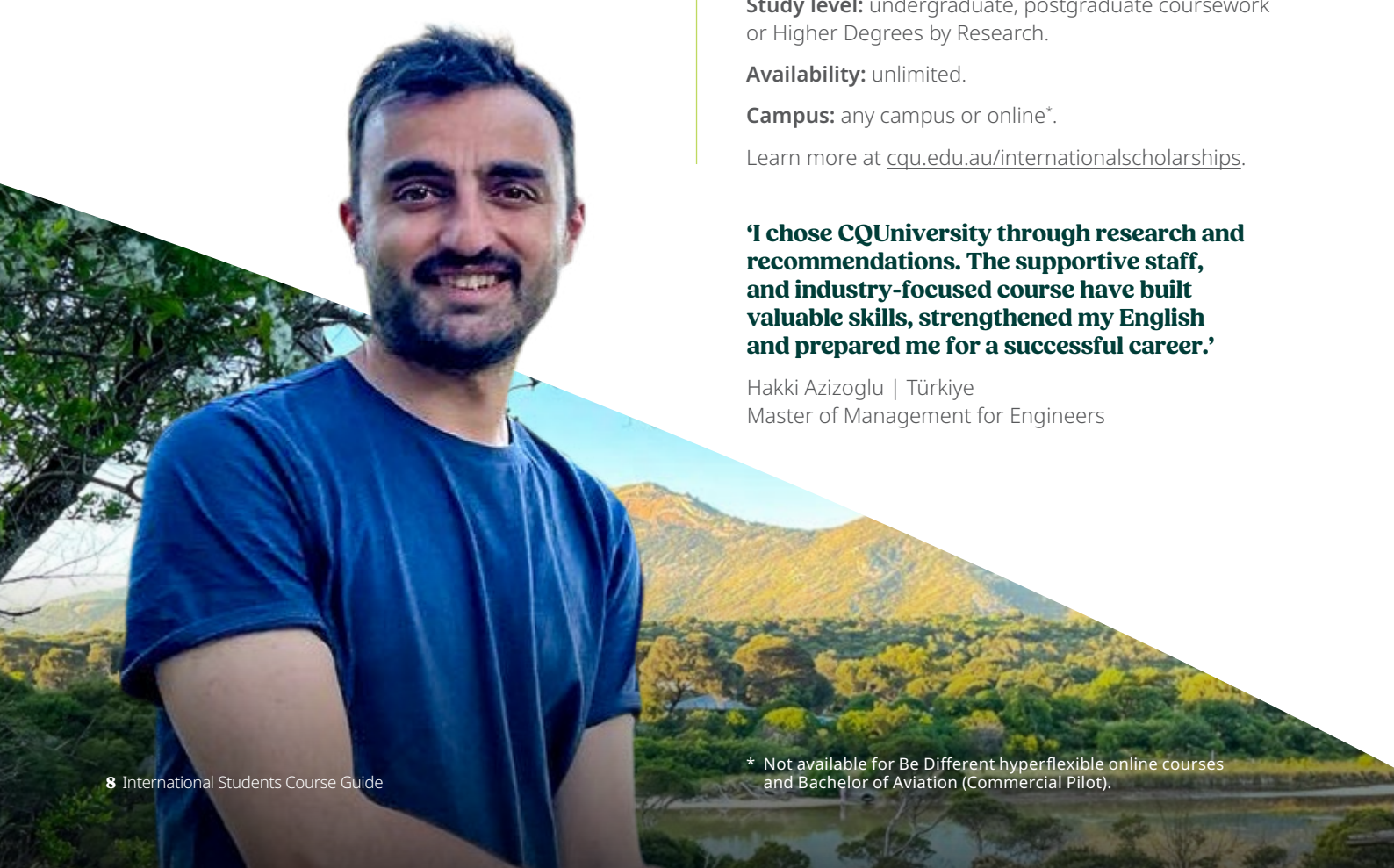

Australian Government and external scholarships

Studying in Australia opens doors to world-class education and global opportunities, and these prestigious scholarships make it even more accessible. Funded by the Australian Government or partner organisations, these programs are designed to support outstanding students who demonstrate academic excellence, leadership potential, and a commitment to making a positive impact in their communities.

These scholarships often cover full course fees and may include living allowances, travel costs, and other benefits, helping you focus on your studies and future career.

RESEARCH TRAINING STIPEND (RTP) SCHOLARSHIP

Funded by the Australian Government, this scholarship provides funding to assist with living costs while undertaking a Higher Degree by Research.

Scholarship value: A\$36 000 per annum.

Eligibility: enrolled in a Higher Degree by Research course at CQUniversity and must not be receiving income from another source that supports general living costs if that income exceeds 75 per cent of the RTP stipend rate.

Study level: Higher Degree by Research.

Availability: limited. Prospective scholarship applicants are invited to apply by the School of Graduate Research.

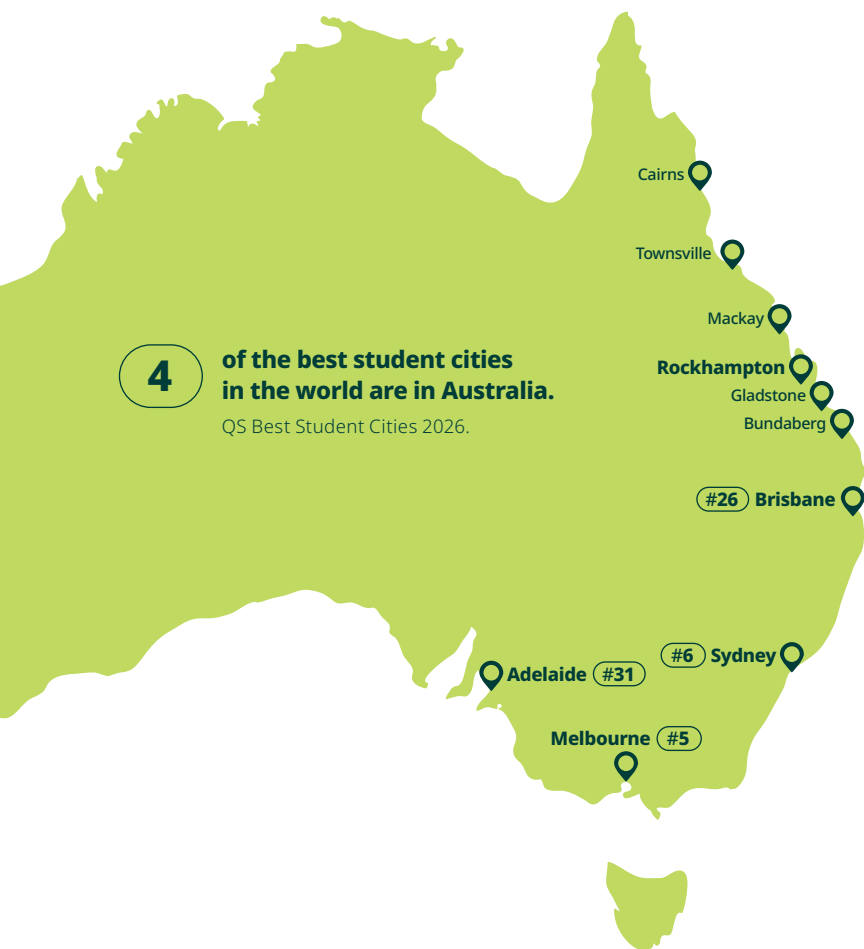

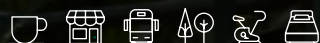

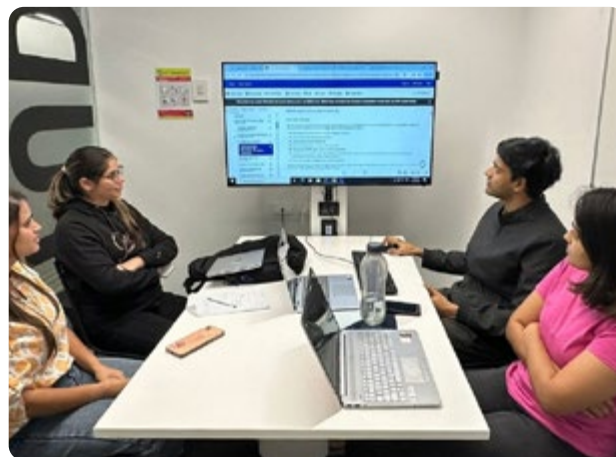

Living expenses are based on a single student.

If you plan to bring family members to Australia, you will need to budget for additional living costs and meet higher financial requirements for your student visa. These extra costs may include school tuition fees for school-aged children. Some students may be eligible for exemptions, for example, Master by Research or PhD students studying at a regional Queensland university.

To meet these requirements, you must stay in Australia with a nominated guardian approved by the Department of Home Affairs. Your guardian can be a parent, person who has legal custody, or an eligible relative who is aged over 21 and is of good character. How to apply

UNDERGRADUATE AND POSTGRADUATE COURSEWORK

Applying for a bachelor degree or masters degree is a straightforward process, and we're here to support you every step of the way.

STEP 1 PREPARE YOUR DOCUMENTS

What is a certified document?

A certified document is a photocopy that has been checked against the original by an authorised person. This person will stamp or sign the copy to confirm it is a true copy. Authorised people include a Justice of the Peace, Commissioner of Declaration, a CQUniversity agent, or the institution that issued the document.

How to apply

HIGHER DEGREES BY RESEARCH

Applying for a Higher Degree by Research (HDR) at CQUniversity is a two-step process that can be started at any time of the year.

STEP 1 PREPARE YOUR EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI)

Start by preparing a research proposal that outlines your intended research area. We recommend exploring CQUniversity's current research focus areas and connecting with potential supervisors whose expertise aligns with your interests. If you're unable to confirm a supervisor at this stage, please submit your EOI anyway, and the School of Graduate Research will assist in identifying a suitable supervisor.

Assessment time: Up to 4 weeks.

STEP 2 SUBMIT FULL APPLICATION

If your EOI is successful and a suitable supervisor is available, you'll be invited to submit a full application. You can apply through an authorised education agent or if eligible, submit your application through our online application system, iStart. To start, visit cqu.edu.au/i-start.

Assessment time: 2–6 weeks, depending on supervisor availability.

APPLICATION PROCESSING TIME

The full cycle from EOI submission through to when you receive an application outcome generally takes 6-10 weeks. We will contact you and your authorised education agent via email, so please check your inbox regularly for updates and next steps.

What is an Expression of Interest (EOI)?

An EOI allows you to submit your proposed research topic for initial assessment. This helps us determine whether your research aligns with our research focus areas and whether a suitable supervisor is available before inviting you to complete a full application. This ensures applicants are well-matched with supervisors and research areas, improving the likelihood of a successful outcome.

HOW TO PREPARE A RESEARCH PROPOSAL

Before you begin, it's helpful to consider these:

- › Is there a gap in current research?
- › What impact will your research make?
- › What will your project title be? (max 30 words)
- › Does your research align with CQUniversity's research focus areas?

Your research proposal should address the following:

- › Background to the proposed research and research question/s to be investigated. (max 500 words)
- › What is the anticipated significance and/or impact of the proposed research? (max 200 words)
- › What research methods will you use to undertake the proposed research? (max 300 words)
- › What are the intended timelines to undertake the proposed research? (max 100 words)
- › What resources, facilities, equipment, fieldwork will be required to undertake the proposed research? (max 200 words)
- › What are the intended research outputs and contribution to research culture. (max 300 words)

How to accept your offer

These steps apply for undergraduate and postgraduate coursework degrees, and Higher Degrees by Research.

STEP 1 START THE PROCESS

- › If you applied through an education agent, let your agent know in writing that you'd like to accept your offer.
- › If you applied directly, log in to iStart to begin.

STEP 2 REVIEW YOUR LETTER OF OFFER

Make sure your course, campus and start date are correct.

STEP 3 MEET ANY CONDITIONS

Check for any academic or English language requirements. You may also need to:

- › attend a genuine student interview
- › provide proof of financial capacity.

If you need to provide certified documents, an authorised person such as a CQUniversity staff or education agent can stamp or sign to confirm they're true copies.

STEP 4 READ AND ACCEPT YOUR STUDENT AGREEMENT

- › Sign your student agreement or click 'Accept' within iStart.
- › Please also review the refund summary.

STEP 5 MAKE YOUR PAYMENT

Pay your deposit, including Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC). BUPA is CQUniversity's preferred provider of OSHC. If you wish to use a different provider, please upload proof of cover. Only pay once you've met all conditions and the above steps have been completed.

You can pay securely via Flywire global payment portal, or if you are in Australia, you'll also have the option to pay on-campus via credit card or BPAY.

Important: Do not pay your deposit until all conditions in your offer have been met.

STEP 6 RECEIVE YOUR CONFIRMATION OF ENROLMENT

Once your acceptance and payment are processed, CQUniversity will issue your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) if you require a student visa.
